Respected members of the community, we have passed another challenging year for the Lewisham Islamic Centre (LIC). As a community and as a centre, we have always been one which seeks to put the issues facing the Ummah at the forefront of everything we do – this has been a vision we have collectively worked on and cultivated over the years and this year has been no different. Over the past year, LIC has been involved with the following:

• Preparing a response to President Macron and raising concerns about the prevalent Islamophobia in France.

• Submitting an open letter to Sir Keir Starmer with respect to the growing reports of Islamophobia in the Labour Party.

• Being invited by the local Labour Party to present on the topic of Islamophobia.

• Penning an open letter to Muslim embassies in the UK to boycott the Beijing Winter Olympics 2022 in response to China's oppression of Uyghur Muslims.



• Standing in solidarity with Masjidul Aqsa and the Palestinians in their struggle for justice. This also saw the Centre develop a 'Quds' policy to outline its position and actions concerning any international issue where Muslims face persecution, prejudice and discrimination.

• Preparing a statement of commemoration with respect to the Srebrenica Memorial Day 2021.

• Supporting a march outside the Chinese embassy with a number of other Muslim organisations in support of the Uyghurs.

• Raising awareness on the 20th anniversary of the Guantanamo Bay detention facility.

The above demonstrates LIC's and the community's proud and unwavering commitment to advocating on behalf of Muslims both home and abroad.

We have no doubt that the coming year will bring many more challenges, and inshaAllah we will continue to face them together as a community. Let us remember that wherever there are challenges, there are always opportunities, and Allah's pleasure must remain the ultimate goal.

At LIC, we can accommodate an average of 2000 attendees on a Friday (Jumm'ah), which increases during the month of Ramadan. Moreover, Eid in Park averages 7000 attendees annually.

Our Friday sermons (kutbah) are usually delivered by Imam Ashraf (deputy Imam), Imam Sabir (deputy Imam) and Imam Shakeel (Head Imam). On occasion, we have special guest Imams including Shaykh Haitham Haddad. We also encourage and instruct young Khatib by giving them a platform at LIC to deliver the sermon (kutbah). To accommodate attendees who are hearing impaired, we shall soon incorporate British sign language interpretation in sermons.



LIC engages the community through Social Media updates of upcoming events, daily activities and live streams of the weekly sermon. Talks and lectures are regularly uploaded onto various social media platforms (Facebook, Telegram, Twitter, Instagram, and Youtube). These online content is for all to benefit from, but more importantly, it allows LIC to interact with members of the wider community, the local council, elected representatives and other organisations, thereby showcasing the valuable work being done within the community.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES

Imam Shakeel Begg (Head Imam), who is supported by Imam Sabir Elahi and Imam Ashraf Dabous (Deputy Imams), manages the spiritual and moral development of the community through leading: a. Daily Prayers, weekly classes and monthly Lectures, Friday and Eid Sermons;

b. Arranging tours for visitors, organising outreach events, holding meetings and weekly Da'wah sessions and annual open days;

c. Imam's Surgery, which includes: counselling, marriage solemnisation, dispute resolution.

ECONOMIC GROWTH & DEVELOPMENT







LIC has provided spaces for local businesses to enable them to provide vital services for the community, such as:

An-Nur Gym

Providing martial arts and self-defence classes for the public benefit (Muslims and non-Muslims alike), the service caters for males and females and holds special sessions for children.

Zaitoon Nursery

A registered preschool for children aged 3-5.

Words of Wisdom bookshop

Information hub and one stop shop for Islamic clothing, books and miscellaneous items.

LIC Studio

This year we have developed an onsite media studio. This has allowed us to professionally live stream our annual fundraiser – Ramadan 27th night – on YouTube.

Estate management – rental income from properties owned by the Centre has been a vital source of income while at the same time providing some much needed housing services to the community.

COMMUNITY WORK

Shahadahs

Alhamdulillah (All Praise be to Allah Almighty), LIC recorded a weekly average of two Shahadahs (Deceleration of Faith) every week over the past year, and what never fails to amaze is the regular diversity of our New Muslims who come from various walks of life, ages and ethnicities.

LIC strongly believes that it is Islam that brings people together, creates and instills in them the bonds of love, brotherhood and sisterhood. As our brother Malcolm X said concerning USA, "America needs to understand Islam, because this is the one religion that erases from its society the race problem".

An important strategy that we have adopted at LIC in supporting our new Muslims who live locally is, in most cases, to appoint a trusted local brother/sister to support and guide that individual in their Journey in Islam. This is taken from the Messenger of Allah (SAW) establishing support for Muhajirin (Migrants that came from Makkah) and The Ansar (Helpers of Madinah).

Alhamdulillah, we see a continuing progression of our New Muslims into becoming key participants and activists in the Muslim Community, organizing core services and activities, and some even becoming service providers in the Lewisham Community.





New Muslim Dinner

LIC organises and leads a Weekly Event/Dinner for New Muslims.

This project is led by our local Brother Zain Holness, who himself embraced Islam at LIC many years ago, and he is also one of our Muaddhins (callers to prayer) at LIC.

The idea behind these Dinners/Events is to truly welcome and engage our new muslims, who understandably may retain questions and seek clarifications, from one of the LIC imams, that are more easily aired over tasty meal. We have realised from the recent 2020/21 pandemic that events and gatherings such as this also greatly help the mental health of the attendees, who are very often new to the community.

Related events have included regular trips and gatherings, and a major part of these events is that every participant is required to give a short beneficial reminder.

This year 2021/22 LIC organised an Umrah Trip to the blessed land of Makkah and Madinah.

COMMUNITY WORK



Alhamdullilah, 1st Lewisham Park Scouts Group has grown to its largest size in its 9-year history. This has been thanks to the great teamwork & leadership of the volunteers who run the Group.

Despite the continued difficulty of Covid-19 restrictions, the Group made history this year: it opened to children aged 4 and over; it started a 'Young Leader' scheme for youth aged 15-18; our young people fundraised in Ramadan by selling Eid gift boxes, and again in the autumn by selling homemade snacks. Some of the children were honoured to help our beloved Cenre fundraise on the 27th night of Ramadan.

Covid 19 Vaccination Clinic

To encourage the COVID vaccination initiative within the local community, LIC held two vaccination clinics at the LIC premises with the support of Lewisham Mayoress Natasha Ricketts, NHS doctors, Nurses & volunteers. The walk in clinics were a successful triumph with a large turnout on both occasions from Muslims and non-Muslim Lewisham residents grateful for the convenience and ease in obtaining their vaccines.

Feed the Homeless

Lewisham Islamic Centre runs a weekly soup kitchen outside the Centre for the homeless and passersby in need of a hot meal. This has been met with a great deal of local enthusiasm and encouragement, and amongst all, gratitude from the most vulnerable persons in the community often feeling neglected and forgotten. Plans for a food bank encountered setbacks due to the pandemic and lockdown. We sincerely hope over the coming year to reinstate this project and offer that little bit of comfort and hope to individuals and families struggling to make ends meet.

Youth Service

Every Thursday, in conjunction with Youth Hub, LIC provides a youth service to support young persons on their journey from formal schooling to full time employment. The service provides employment application guidance, links to employers, and access to Lewisham Council initiatives such as <u>apprentices</u>hips and the Kickstart project.

Information Stall

Lewisham Islamic Centre Volunteers are noticeable every Saturday between 12 noon - 3pm outside of Lewisham Library at our information and dawah stall. We proactively engage the public who may be curious or even skeptical about Islam and Muslims, or who are actively learning about them. It offers conversations galore and free Islamic reading material to take away. It is an active way of making our presence as Muslims known and to instill confidence in the public to approach a Muslim and politely ask about our faith and true practices so strikingly at odds with what is nominally peddled in the media.



FIQH OF FASTING -GLUTTONY

Ramadan is upon us again by the grace of Allah. A time of sacrifice, dedication, rejoice and celebration. It is also a time for reflection. There has perhaps never been more pertinent a time for us as believers and seekers of the next life to reflect.

Why so? If we look around us, for the keen eye, it is quite apparent that we as a society have fallen victim to the gluttonous nature of lowly desire. Gluttony, a sin of habitual greed. A sin condemned by all of the Abrahamic faiths, a sin which leads to not only destruction of oneself but general society as well. What if though, what we here refer to as a sin – gluttony – has today become a virtue? Greed re-labelled as success; the more one acquires, the greater his success. Wants perceived as needs. Desires seen as dreams. How can the seeker of Allah's pleasure and the follower of His framework determine his lust-filled greed from his justified needs?

Ramadan provides an insight. How so? Imam al-Ghazali speaks about the stomach, 'The greatest means of peril for the son of Adam is the desire of his stomach. Through it Adam and Hawa were cast out of the gardens of eternity to the lowly grounds of the abode of humility and impoverishment. They were ordered to stay away from the tree but their desire got the best of them. The stomach truly is the spring of all desire, and the source of all sickness and corruption. The reason for this being that the desire of the private part follows (the filling) of the stomach. Once the stomach is filled, carnality and lust follow. What follows the desire of food and sexual appetite is an intense want for status and wealth; as they are the means for one to expand his reach in consumption of food and fulfilment of lustful appetite.

Folly and heedlessness then follows this intense urge for increased wealth and status, which leads to competitiveness (with others seeking the same) and envy. From them the destructive sins of flaunting, hoarding, arrogance and showing off are born. This leads a person to hatred for others (and others hatred for him), more sin and illicit behaviour. All of this born from carelessness with filling one's stomach.'

How does this relate to Ramadan? Ramadan centres around abstaining from lawfully filling the stomach and fulfilling one's sexual appetite. In doing so, this month provides an opportunity to reflect individually and collectively over what we really need in contrast to what we want. Knowing that over-indulging, even in that which is permissible, can lead to the above, should we always give our bodies what they want?

Society will tell us to indulge, to buy, to eat, to drink, to be merry and 'enjoy life'. Because without us doing so the modern economy we have built will collapse. An economy based upon consumption and consumerism. Desires are good for consumerism. Abstinence is not. We are now seeing the cost of such a model, one where moral decay in the name of acquirement (whether wealth or status, particularly online status) has become the accepted norm. It is not our norm though as believers. We have a moral duty to ourselves and those we live amongst to be torch bearers of the prophetic ways. A key concept of which is to say no to the lower self. The Prophet - Allah's peace and blessings upon him - said, 'Man has not filled a vessel more wicked than his stomach.' With Imam al-Ghazali's above mentioned description of where the stomach can lead a person, why the stomach is labelled as wicked becomes clear.

Ramadan reminds us of our ability to say no to ourselves, and in doing so we feel the connection to Allah re-emerge in our lives. Perhaps this year we can make it a goal to say no not only during the blessed month of Ramadan, but as we live out our remaining days in this temporary abode. Knowing that just as we break our fast from abstinence at sunset during Ramadan, we will break our fast from this life as we transition to the next.

Friday Collection

As a growing and thriving Centre, funding is paramount and 99% of the Centre's income is generated from the Muslim community. The lion share of this comes from weekly collections after Friday prayers which averages £2700 per week post pandemic compared to the pre-pandemic average of £1,500 per week. We have introduced SumUp machines that allow the attendees to simply tap/touch their payment cards and donate with ease. Moreover, three charity boxes with PDQ devices at the entrance to the Centre encourages attendees to donate.

Standing Orders

Supplementary income for LIC comes from standing order mandates. We collect £2,300 in standing orders every month. If you would like to make regular donations through standing order, you can do so by scanning the barcode.

Fundraising for the New Development

On the 27th night every Ramadan, an online, onsite fundraiser is held to realise the vision of leaving a Legacy through the development of a purpose built mosque and Islamic Centre in the London borough of Lewisham. Money pledges are collected where attendees are not in a position to donate lump sums, and these pledges are redeemed over specified period of time. The event is live streamed on YouTube where viewers are encouraged to donate online or via phone. This past Ramadan, we raised £140,018. (Include barcode!!!)


